The Human Side of Health is seeking passionate college and university students (18 years of age or older) who are studying **Performing Arts, Health Promotion, Public Health, Healthcare, Human Services, Communications, Marketing, or related fields** to participate in this exciting virtual initiative.

About *The Human Side of Health*:

The Human Side of Health is a virtual theatre and community health education initiative that presents professionally produced, 10-minute original plays inspired by important health topics. Each production is followed by a recorded discussion featuring the playwright, cast, and invited health professionals, creating meaningful conversations that educate, reduce stigma, and connect communities through storytelling.

Interns become part of a collaborative team that supports the planning, production, promotion, and virtual presentation of the series while gaining hands-on experience working alongside professionals in the performing arts, public health, healthcare, and human services.

This internship provides students with meaningful, hands-on experience at the intersection of storytelling, theatre, and community health education while supporting a growing virtual arts and health initiative.

Internship Responsibilities:

Interns may assist in one or more of the following areas based on project needs and individual interests:

- Communication and social media support
- Virtual event and Zoom facilitation support
- Project coordination and scheduling
- Community outreach and partnership engagement
- Marketing and promotional activities
- Production and rehearsal support
- Administrative and organizational tasks
- Other project-related duties as assigned

Preferred Qualifications:

Applicants should:



- Be at least 18 years of age.
- Be currently enrolled in or recently graduated from a college or university.
- Demonstrate professionalism, reliability, and strong communication skills.
- Be comfortable working in a virtual environment.
- Have an interest in theatre, public health, healthcare, education, or community engagement.
- Have regular access to a computer and Wifi connection
- Be able to work independently while collaborating with a virtual team.

Interns will have opportunities to:

- Gain practical experience supporting a multidisciplinary arts and health initiative.
- Develop professional communication, leadership, and project management skills.
- Network with playwrights, actors, educators, healthcare professionals, and public health practitioners.
- Receive mentorship and professional guidance throughout the internship.
- Strengthen their résumé and portfolio through meaningful project experience.

- Location: Remote (Virtual)
- Hours: Flexible and scheduled around academic commitments.
- Duration: Varies based on semester and project needs.
- Compensation: This internship is unpaid.
- Academic Credit: Students are encouraged to determine whether their institution offers academic credit for internships. *The Human Side of Health* will cooperate with reasonable documentation requirements but cannot guarantee that academic credit will be awarded.
